A Brief History of the Commerce Community Action Program 2022

During the year of 2013, I had been discharged to come home from Lake Pointe Rehabilitation Center in Rowlett, Texas. I was assigned a home health aide by the name of Hazel Myberry. Hazel was a delightful person who departed this world in November 2020. Hazel and I had many discussions about the problems of African American children growing up in Commerce, Texas. Hazel said that the young male children, in particular from her own family, entered the adult world feeling lost. They had, she said, problems finding employment, being fathers and, generally speaking, “just fitting in” with society. She knew of my background in social work and asked me what I could do. I said, “Hazel, I don’t know just what I can do to help, but I will try to set the wheels in motion to identify problems and see what can be done to help.”

After pondering the issues to include systemic racism, lack of self-motivation and other issues affecting and effecting both male and female persons in Commerce, I called a meeting in the Norris Community at the Champion Community Center which was a barbecue with all the trimmings. It was well attended. The focus of the meeting was to talk about social problems in the community.

Some years back, there was an issue about contamination of the water and related matters in the Norris Community due to a chemical fertilizer plant in the area. Although a legal settlement was reached, there was much distrust that lingered in the community, particularly involving the black towards white people. This being said, there was (and still is) a sense of distrust and lack of acceptance of many blacks towards whites.

The churches in the Norris Community reflected the community’s character. The most well established is the Mount Moriah Baptist Church. Harry Turner is a deacon and has been a board member for many years in our organization.

After several meetings in the Norris Community, and with persons of leadership positions in Commerce, it was decided to develop our program.

The name **Commerce Community Action Program** was recommended by Dr. R. John Ballotti, Professor of Speech at Texas A&M University-Commerce. A heavy representation from the university faculty was called on, as well as, selected socially minded persons from the town.

After several meetings, we decided on a core set of values. Those being, that we would help others to help themselves, and that we would try our best to work with persons who wanted a hand up, not a hand out.

Some Important Historical and Personal Thoughts Shared About the C-CAP

I joined C-CAP around 2013, because a high school friend of mine Emma Martin (City Council Member) felt that I might be a good individual to represent Mt. Moriah Church and the Norris Community. Other than the Boy Scouts and NAACP, I had never belonged to any other such group or program. I knew what other organizations did, but was never a member.

What persuaded me to join was a phone call from the program's president, Dr. Bob Johnson who invited me to lunch at the local McDonalds. I went for the meal, but after meeting and talking with him I was impressed with his intense desire to help those in need. I could see in him a deep dedication to be of some aid or help to all people. And "BAM" I was sold - as they say "hook line and sinker."

Today I serve as board treasurer in the administration of this program, a position I am privileged to fulfill. All of the members seem to share the same basic belief in how they can have a meaningful impact on the lives of those who truly need help.

Commerce Community Action Program (C-CAP) addresses the needs of our diverse society, paying no attention to ethnicity. Various school programs are either fully or partially financed by the C-CAP. We as board members have personally participated in some programs in the Commerce Middle School.

At certain times of the year, C-CAP helps by co-sponsoring certain designated holidays such as "Juneteenth" for African Americans and "Cinco de Mayo," a Hispanic celebration. Smaller events are also co-sponsored throughout the year. The organization exists on the generosity of others, we neither make nor sell any product. The funds that are spent are agreed to by all the members and are for a worthwhile purpose.

The officers and board members are all local citizens. Some are laypersons, others are professional people, business people, and those with doctoral degrees. C-CAP is fortunate to have a variety of members with diverse backgrounds.

There is much more to be said about this organization - its importance and need in the community because of the times we now live in. I will stop at this point as "I think you get it." I love this organization and am honored to be a part of it.


